Music - Find some songs that became famous during World War 1. Explain which one is your favourite and give reasons why. Maybe you could perform it to the class.




Draw - Tanks were first used by the British in WW1.

Create - A model of a gas mask. If trying it on, make sure you are able to breathe! Think about what materials you might use. You might be able to make a box to carry it in too.




