

MATHS

- place value: count, read and write 2-digit numbers, represent numbers as tens and ones and compare and order numbers.
- addition and subtraction: read and write addition and subtraction sums, add and subtract using a range of methods and resources, recall addition and subtraction facts to 20 and 100, solve problems and recognise the inverse relationship.

SCIENCE

- identify, name, draw and label the basic parts of the human body and say which part of the body is associated with each sense
- identify and name a variety of common animals including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals
- identify and name a variety of common animals that are carnivores, herbivores and omnivores
- describe and compare the structure of a variety of common animals
- gather and record data to help in answering questions

LITERACY

- Reading: apply phonics skills to decode words and recognise common exception words in group and independent reading.
- Writing: produce non-fiction writing about their homes and pets and fiction writing based on the traditional tale of the three little pigs
- daily phonics > phase 5
- weekly spellings > Y1 and Y2 term 1A
- handwriting > form lower and capital letters correctly

GEOGRAPHY

- use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to human and physical features
- use simple fieldwork and observational skills to study the geography of their school and its grounds
