80th Anniversary D-Day Celebrations

We are planning a special event, just after D-Day, to commemorate the

80th Anniversary of the end of World War Two.

ATTENTION PARENTS!

Help us today to cherish and be thankful for our loved ones.

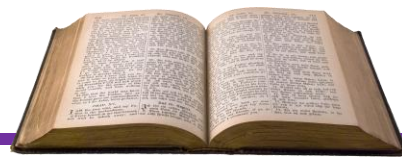
Bless our family, friends, colleagues and members of our community, God.
