Wraparound Care

Thankyou to everyone who attended the meeting this week. We are committed to providing wraparound care at Flushing, however, currently the provision is being heavily subsidised by the school budget. In order for it to be financially feasible, we need to make some changes.

At the meeting we presented 4 different options:

- 1. Increase the amount per session. To break even we would need to charge:
 - Session 1 (3.15-4.30) at £6 and Session 2 (4.30-5.30) at £12. This is based on 18 children attending per day for us to break even.
- 2. Only run Session 1 at £6 per session, our data shows that the second session is much less well attended and often does not cover staffing costs.
- 3. Not run on a Friday on average 4 children attend this session each week. Again, this doesn't cover staffing costs.
- 4. Find an alternative provider Plymouth Argyle can offer:
 - Session 1 (3.15-4.30) at £5.50 and Session 2 (4.30-5.30) at £11
 - They would offer a snack and sport/creative activity on site and would use one of their staff and 1 of our existing staff.
 - Booking would be through them and reduce booking costs for the school.

The parents who attended the meeting asked if Plymouth Argyle could come to talk to parents about their provision and we are looking to arrange a date for this.
