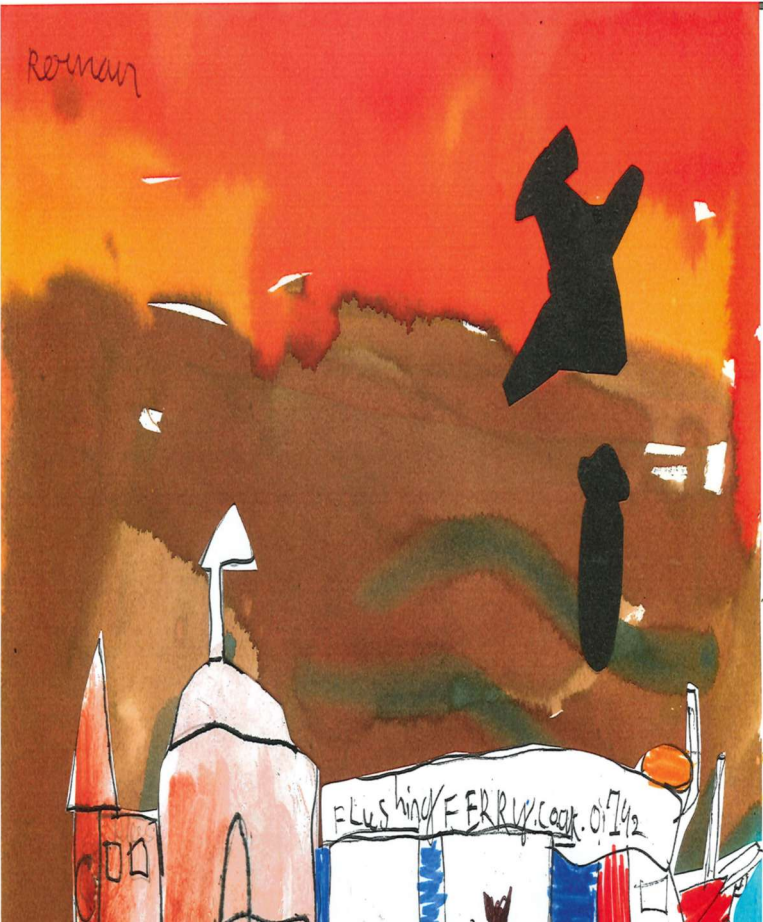

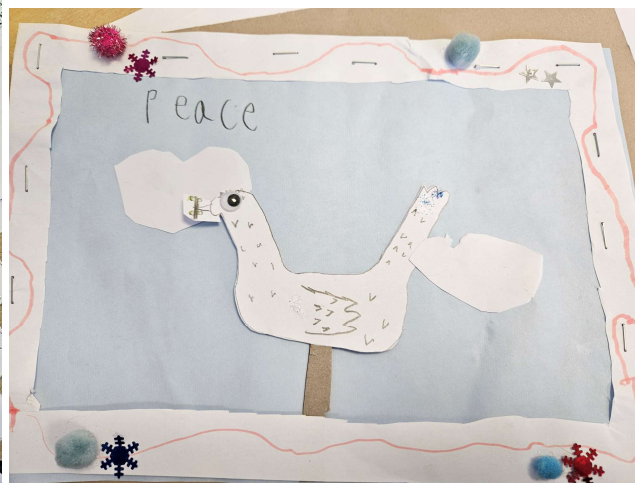
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**Happy National Support Staff Appreciation Day to all our wonderful staff!
