The Royal British Legion have dropped off Poppies to buy ahead of Remembrance Day 11th November.



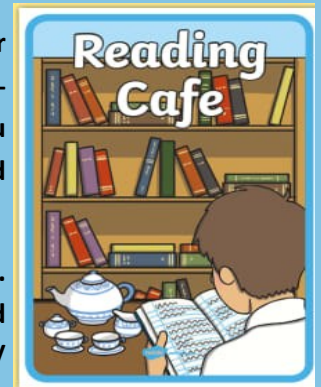
We will be selling them next week and the week after half term from the school office.

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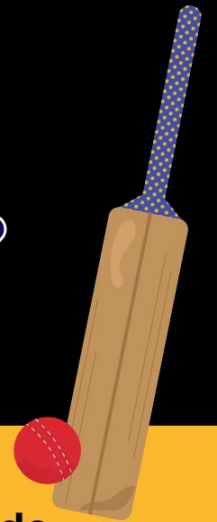
